1800's - South American colonies win independence from Spain and Portugal

1808 - 1910 - Colonization of Africa by various European nations

1840 - 1876 David Livingstone, missionary, explores Africa

1848 - Marx publishes The Communist Manifesto

1867 - Marx publishes Das Kapital

1867 - Canada becomes a self-governing Commonwealth of Britain

1859 - Darwin publishes The Origin of the Species

1871- Italy united

1871 - Germany united

1876 - Alexander Graham Bell patents telephone

1879 - Edison invents light bulb

1898 - Spanish American War

1898 - The US annexes Hawaii and obtains Puerto Rice, the Philippines and Guam

1899 - 1901 – Boer War

1900 - Queen Victoria rules over 1/5 of world (rules from 1837 – 1901)

Hurricane hits Galveston Island, 6000 killed – one of worst U.S. natural disasters

1900 - Spindletop - rush for oil in Western US

1900 - Work begins on New York Subway

1900 -1901 - Boxer Rebellion- China

1901 - Australia becomes an independent commonwealth of Britain

1901 - Andrew Carnegie sells U.S. Steel, begins to give away \$350 million

1901 - Gillette invents disposable razor

1903- Wright Brothers complete first successful airplane flight.

1904-1905- Russo-Japanese War

1905 - Einstein publishes the Theory of Relativity

1906 - Vitamins discovered

1906 - The word "Allergy" is first used

1906 - Cornflakes invented

1906 - Earthquake and resulting fires destroy much of San Francisco

1906 - Coca Cola replaces cocaine with "spent cocaine" (dates vary)
